

## Supreme Court of Queensland decision 12 June 2019

## Key issue: Breach of Trust - the meaning of 'breach of the trust placed in the person'

The Supreme Court of Queensland recently considered the meaning of the phrase 'breach of the trust placed in the person' in a police disciplinary context.

The decision also considered the meaning of 'trust' in the context of a 'breach of trust' and found the following definition to be appropriate:

'the obligation or responsibility imposed on someone in whom confidence is placed or authority is vested, or who has undertaken to carry out a particular duty or role'.

A breach of that trust is breaking that obligation or failing in that responsibility.

When the Office of the Independent Assessor alleges a breach of trust it will always be linked back to a breach of one of the <u>local government principles</u> in Section 4 or the <u>responsibilities of councillors</u> in Section 12 of the Local Government Act 2009.
